Reading aloud with your child throughout their primary school years has significant, positive effects on their learning and reading skills. Listening to your child as you read together also builds their social skills and confidence as they engage with you, and the quality time that you spend with them raises their mood and sense of wellbeing.

Protective Behaviours

Starting this term, we will be implementing our newly updated Health Education Curriculum. As part of the updates, students will be learning *Protective Behaviours* every term (in the past, students have been taught this topic once a year). *Protective Behaviours* is a prevention program which teaches children the skills they need to accurately recognise their own feelings, to maintain control of their personal safety and to identify networks of trust within their local community. The aim is to empower students with the skills to keep themselves safe from harm. This program has been designed by the Department of Education and is fully aligned with the Western Australian Curriculum.

The topics that will be covered include:

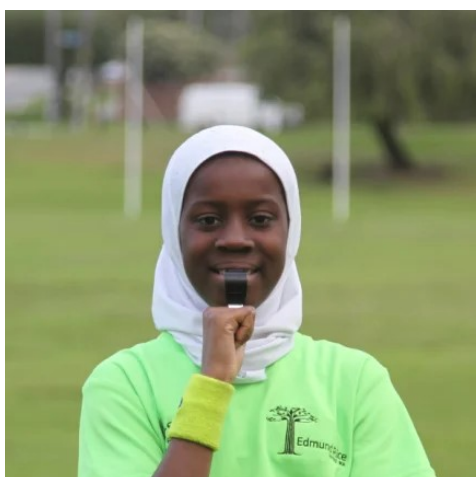
- Feeling Safe
- Early Warning Signs
- Safety Continuum and Problem Solving
- Secrets
- Networks
- Persistence
- Body Ownership / Public and Private
- Personal Space
- Assertiveness

Students may bring home worksheets, homework or information that they will share with you regarding their lessons. We encourage you to engage in conversations with your child/ren about their learning and help to support their understanding. If you have any questions please speak to the class teacher.

TERRACYCLE Dish and Air Care Recycling Program

We are now recycling dish and air care packaging in the yellow bins.

Accepted waste: Any brand of dish care and air care packaging, including:

- Dishwashing liquid bottles (including caps).
- Dishwashing tablets flexible packaging (including snap locks and zip locks).
- Air freshener aerosol cans and spray bottles (including spray and trigger heads).
- Plug-in air fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging).
- Clip-on car fresheners and refills (including plastic outer packaging).

Please note: cardboard and paper packaging is recyclable through regular council recycling. Please do not include these in your collections for this program.
