## Wonder Recycling Rewards Help us turn bread bags of any kind/ brand into school play equipment

To support our Wonder Recycling Rewards Program, students are asked to collect bread bags (any brand), and deliver them to the library.

Wonder Recycling Rewards is a fun and easy program created to collect and recycle bread bags (of any kind / brand) at school. Once collected, Wonder is going to turn the plastic into wonderful things like school play equipment.

As a registered school, our recycling efforts will earn us rewards points, to redeem for new sports equipment. We also go into the draw to win an exercise circuit made from the recycled plastic we collect!

It is important that items being recycled are not contaminated with other products and are as clean as possible.

The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic, then it's a bread bag. If it hasn't contained bread, then it's not a bread bag.

Bread bags should be free from crumbs to ensure no contamination during the recycling process, but they do not need to be washed.





### Free rapid antigen tests

Free rapid antigen tests (RATs) package allocated for your child/children is ready for collection.

Each child receives an allocation of 20 RATs. This allocation supports the strategy to keep the school community COVID-19 safe. Use a RAT to test your child for COVID-19 if they have symptoms or are a household close contact. If your child is a close contact, they are permitted to attend school, as long as they receive a negative daily RAT result, remain asymptomatic, and wear a mask (Year 7 and above).

We will be handing out the RATs as follows:  
Parents/carers can collect from the **front office from 8am until 4pm**, starting today Wednesday 10 August. We are unable to give them to students.

If you are unable to collect and would like someone else to collect on your behalf, please email us at [Camboon.ps@education.wa.edu.au](mailto:Camboon.ps@education.wa.edu.au)

If your child has COVID-19 symptoms, they should stay home and be tested. Please continue to notify the school if your child tests positive for COVID-19 or if they are a household close contact. For more information on testing and isolation requirements, go to the [HealthyWA website](https://www.health.wa.gov.au/healthywa).

Thank you for your continued efforts in keeping our school COVID-19 safe.

**Larrikin Cash Vouchers** – This works just like real cash, and even prints out to look like money! It's set up as an online item where you can simply enter any amount you wish. (Please don't add the actual products to your online cart, just the Larrikin Cash item, as products need to be collected from the Book Fair). Once you pass through the checkout, you will then receive an email with your Larrikin Cash, which you can then print out and give to your child to use at the Book Fair. (If you don't receive the email immediately after checkout, please check your spam/junk mail folder.) Your child will then bring the Larrikin Cash voucher and the Wish List to the fair.

You are effectively buying a voucher that can then be exchanged for any items at the Book Fair.

We will also be accepting regular cash and credit card/EFTPOS payments at school during the Book Fair too.


Although every effort will be made to ensure your child brings home the correct item/s there could be a lack of stock. You can reorder any book that has sold out at the fair. If there is a discrepancy, please contact us and we will resolve it as best we can.
